

STORA HÄLSINGEGÅRDARS VÄG

The Hälsingland Farm Trail is an up-and-coming tourist trail, which meanders through and past the villages and districts that are home to the biggest Hälsingland farmhouses, the most magnificent porches and most extravagantly painted interiors.

HUNDREDS OF FARMHOUSES are scattered like jewels over the province. Some of the farms and villages are UNESCO World Heritage Site candidates. The trail, which takes you through a cultural landscape that is a thousand years old, stretches from the banks of the Voxna river to the vast forests of the north, home to the farms' summer pastures. These pastures are also part of the World Heritage Site candidacy. The flax scutcheries, mills and sawmills of the watercourses that flow from the wooded high country down through villages to the river bear witness to the agriculture that made the Hälsingland farmers rich.

Ol-Anders in Alfta. The farm lies by route 50 and is the gateway to the Hälsingland Farmhouse Trail. Open farm with tourist office and Emigrant museum. Open all year round.
Löka in Gundbo. Open farm with local heritage museum. Open during the summer months.
Märtes in Edsbyn. Open farm and Ovanåker's heritage centre. Open during the summer months.
